General Provincial Regulations

British Columbia's top priorities are protecting young people, promoting health and safety, keeping the criminal element out of cannabis, keeping our roads safe, and supporting economic development.

Use of non-medical cannabis in public spaces will generally be allowed in B.C. where tobacco smoking and vaping are permitted, however:

- Smoking and vaping non-medical cannabis banned in areas frequented by children, bus stops and other places;
- All use of cannabis banned for all occupants in operating vehicles;
- Landlords and strata councils can restrict at tenanted and strata properties; and
- Local governments able to set additional restrictions.

Personal Cultivation up to four non-medical cannabis plants per household will be allowed in B.C., however:

- The plants must not be visible from public spaces off the property;
- Banned in dwellings with daycares; and
- Landlords and strata councils can restrict or prohibit home cultivation.

The minimum age to possess, purchase and consume cannabis in B.C. will be 19.

Possession in a public place of up to 30 grams will be allowed for adults aged 19+.

Drug impaired driving will continue to be illegal in B.C. and the Province will:




- Add a new 90-day driving prohibition for drug affected driving; and
- Extend the Graduated Licensing Program's current zero alcohol tolerance restrictions to THC (the primary active chemical in cannabis).



Proposed Policy

Rezoning Considerations:

- Storefront cannabis retailers will only be considered in an established retail location where the current zoning permits retail sales.
- A storefront cannabis
- **3** Cannabis sales are **not** permitted at special events, public markets or farmers markets.
- **4.** This policy does **not limit Council from considering**

retailer should be:

- At least 300m (in a straight line from closest lot line to closest lot line) from a public or independent preschool, elementary, middle or secondary **school** including the Comox Valley Child Development Association.
- At least 400m (in a straight line from closest lot line to closest lot line) from another lot where a storefront cannabis retailer is permitted,

variances to the separation distances noted in (2) based on circumstances related to a specific application.


- **5.** The off-street parking requirements applicable to retail stores as outlined in Division 7 of Zoning Bylaw 2500, 2007 and amendments thereto will apply to storefront cannabis retailers.
- **6**. Only one storefront cannabis retailer will be allowed per lot.

Business Licence

Cannabis products must not be visible from outside the store and advertising must comply with federal laws.

 Federal advertising laws generally protect against advertising appealing to children or conveying misinformation Only non-medical cannabis and cannabis accessories may be sold in Cannabis retail stores:

- (specifically dried cannabis, cannabis oils and seeds that comply with federal requirements);
- Cannabis edibles and medical cannabis not permitted though may be at later dates;

Stores may operate 9am-11pm

 Federal advertising laws generally protect against advertising appealing to children or conveying misinformation

In-store consumption and samples will be prohibited

Stores may sell up to 30 grams of dried cannabis

 Sales of alcohol, pharmaceuticals, snacks, tobacco, or other non-cannabis related items will be prohibited and the cannabis retail must be a self-contained business

Pricing policy work is ongoing

Inventory must be stored onsite

• Local governments may impose
