#### **Calls for Service**

In the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, there was a 5 percent decrease in Calls for Service in Courtenay relative to the first quarter of the previous fiscal year.

The most common type of Call for Service in Courtenay in the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year was Unwanted Person. Relative to the first quarter of the previous fiscal year, there were decreases in all but three of the most common types of Call for Service.

#### Most Common Call Locations (Excluding RCMP Detachment)

The location with the most Calls for Service in Courtenay in the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year was the Connect Warming Centre. In this quarter, there were notable increases in Calls for Service at City Hall, a private residence, and the Crown Isle Shopping Plaza.

- The increase in Calls for Service at City Hall was largely attributable to the creation of Trespass files for individuals at this location.
- The Calls for Service at the private residence were predominantly related to an individual's mental health issues.
- The increase in Calls for Service at the Crown Isle Shopping Plaza largely pertained to complaints regarding Unwanted Persons and Disturbances at Thrifty Foods.

#### Most Common Downtown Calls for Service

The most common type of Call for Service in Downtown Courtenay in the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year was Unwanted Person. Relative to the first quarter of the previous fiscal year, there was an overall 7 percent decrease in Calls for Service in Downtown Courtenay (23-24)

Q1 =929; 24-25 Q1=868). However, there were notable increases in Calls for Service regarding Theft, Breach, Assault, and Drugs.

## **Violent Crime**

In the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, there were 253 Violent Crime files in Courtenay. This was a 2 percent decrease from the 258 Violent Crime files in the first quarter of the previous fiscal year.

## Types of Violent Crime


In the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the most common type of Violent Crime file in Courtenay was Assault. Relative to the first quarter of the previous fiscal year, there was an 11 percent (14 file) decrease in Assault files in the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year. However, there was a notable increase in street-level Robberies.

In the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, there were 629 Property Crime files in Courtenay. This was a 2 percent increase over the 614 Property Crime files in the first quarter of the previous fiscal year.


## Types of Property Crime

In the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the most common type of Property Crime file in Courtenay was Mischief to Property and there were notable increases in Shoplifting and Residential Break and Enters. The increase in Residential Break and Enters was largely attributable to a crime spree by one individual who was arrested and charged.

## **CDSA Offences**

In the first quarter of the 2024-2025 fiscal year, there were 50 CDSA Offence files in Courtenay. This was a 285 percent increase over the 13 CDSA Offence files in the first quarter of the previous fiscal year. This increase may be influenced by the Province of British Columbia's decision to ban drug use in public spaces.
